












# Lääne-Harju Arena - Sustainability in Education

- Systemic process through which local communities co-create a vision and action plan for transitioning to sustainable and impact-driven education.
- Including people from schools, kindergartens, private sector organisations, NGO-s, parents, municipal officials and youth.
- 3 full day workshops (33 participants) + inclusion meetings with different stakeholders





















- Youth Wellbeing Concerns Low satisfaction among students with physical activity options.
- Outdated Learning Environments Many school environments lack accessibility, flexibility, and outdoor learning opportunities.
- Environmental Responsibility A real need to instill environmental awareness and sustainable practices in daily school life due to climate challenges and the municipality's coastal location.
- Fragmented Environmental Education Environmental themes are inconsistently integrated into learning, limiting students' understanding of sustainability and ecological systems.
- Need for Community Connection There's a drive to better connect students with their surroundings—nature, local businesses, and cultural heritage—to foster responsibility and belonging.












#### Nature and Sustainability

- Improving energy efficiency in schools (e.g. audits, retrofits).
- Waste sorting and food waste reduction (currently being implemented).
- Climate and environmental education for students and teachers.
- Designing of a new study programme with Estonian Maritime Academy (currently being implemented).
- Marine ecosystem education: trips to harbors, learning about biodiversity and water safety in cooperation with local rescue services.
- Hands-on sustainability practices: repair workshops, use of recycled materials in arts.


### Health and Wellbeing

- Wellbeing-Centered Learning Spaces:
  - Pilot block lessons to support concentration and balance.
  - Accessibility audits of school buildings.
- Movement and **Outdoor Learning**:
  - Developing schoolyards and gardens for learning and recreation (currently being implemented).
  - Expanding safe cycling and walking paths (light traffic roads).
  - Designing areas for active rest (e.g. climbing zones).
  - Building bike shelters at all schools and expanding bike lanes.
  - Creating nature trails near schools.
  - Incorporating outdoor education and frequent field trips to museums and landmarks.

## Health and Wellbeing

- Strengthening **Mentorship** and Belonging (currently being implemented):
  - Redefining the class teacher role to enhance support and mentoring.
  - Increasing salaries and training for class teachers.
  - Promoting trusting relationships and positive classroom climate.

#### **Healthier Eating:**

- Broader selection of **nutritious school meals**, including **plant-based options**.
- Regular provision of fruits and vegetables.
- Student involvement in meal planning.
