Focus group discussions

- Different topics (e.g. circular economy, biodiversity, food etc.)
- Common understanding on topic and role of different actors
- Provided a basis for defining challenges and planning the local transition arena workshops

Arena workshops

- Three main workshops: 1) Visioning, 2)
 Pathways (backgasting) 3) Solutions and actions
- Moving fast to concrete actions
- Various results: initiatives, experiments, new cooperation models, messages to decision-makers etc.
- Establishing working groups and supporting












Key learnings

- Avoid complexity and difficult language as there are participants with different educational backgrounds – value of "grassroot expertise"
- Avoid political terms and debates: if you involve decision-makers, take care that they are from different political parties, arena must be politically neutral
- Strong involvement and commitment of local authorities important
- No pre-defined strategies or visions, looking beyond structures
- No pre-defined results, but take care to make a transformative impact on strategies and plans
- Support implementation of results and welcome also new people on









WMT! added value

- 1. Empowering people, empowering new cooperation
- Inviting people from different levels
- Also new people can join along the way
- Empowering new people to get involved also after the workshops
- 2. Real co-creation instead of only involving
- 3. Elements of the method to be integrated in regular planning processes
