Specific challenge


Lack of adjusted measures to support blue economy solutions and enhance climate resilience in small coastal municipalities in LV, LT, PL and DE.

Output (s)

- Joint action plan
- List of measures for blue economy development
- Blue economy products based on local resources



- Explain what you plan to do and how
- Describe how you involve target groups
- Be clear about content & purpose of outputs
- Specify which organisations will be using outputs



- Avoid general statements & buzzwords
- Explain how outputs will be used, not "can be" or "maybe" used
- Explore what has already been produced
- Be realistic with your timeline
