


- Empower cooperation between local authorities, civil society and business actors to enhance ecological and social sustainability.

- Improve awareness of the role of grassroot actors in social innovations and sustainability transition











Focus group discussions


- Different topics (e.g. circular economy, biodiversity, food etc.)








WMT! added value

- 1. Empowering people, empowering new cooperation
- Inviting people from different levels
- Also new people can join along the way
- Empowering new people to get involved also after the workshops
- 2. Supportive role of external experts and speakers
- 3. Real co-creation instead of only involving
- 4. Elements of the method to be integrated in regular planning processes









Key learnings

- Avoid complexity and abstract and political terms
- Ensure political neutrality
- Strong involvement and commitment of local authorities
- No pre-defined strategies or visions, looking beyond structures
- No pre-defined results, trust the process
- Support implementation of results and welcome also new people on board!
- -> INTERREG BSR project structure enables!








