



How to Reduce Single-Use Plastic

SIMPLE TIPS

DAUGAVPILS: Raising Awareness and Changing Habits in the Workplace

- UNDERSTAND YOUR WASTE: Start by identifying the types and amounts of plastic waste generated.
- ENGAGE STAFF: Encourage open discussions and involve employees in finding solutions.
- **IMPROVE WASTE MANAGEMENT:** Begin recycling plastics and metals; collaborate with cleaning staff for proper sorting.
- PROMOTE SUSTAINABLE CHOICES: Support employees in making eco-friendly purchasing decisions.
- **TRACK PROGRESS:** Use inventory tracking to monitor changes and improvements.



TALLINN: Greener Eventswith Less Plastic

- PROMOTE REUSABLES: Ask
 participants to bring their own water
 bottles and provide refill stations.
- USE REUSABLE MATERIALS: Offer reusable cups, tableware, and race bibs with safety pins.
- SORT WASTE EFFECTIVELY:
 Provide clearly labeled bins for different waste types.
- AVOID SINGLE-USE GIVEAWAYS: Skip balloons, leaflets, and other disposable souvenirs.
- THINK BEYOND WASTE: Encourage public transport and greener commuting options.

HELSINKI: Reducing Plastic in Office Environments

- TARGET FOOD PACKAGING: Identify food and snack packaging as a major plastic source.
- ENCOURAGE HOMEMADE MEALS: Inspire staff to bring lunch from home or cook together.
- **RETHINK WASTE BAG USE:** Reduce the number of waste bags used and change them less frequently.
- **BUY IN BULK:** Use economy-sized packaging for shared kitchen items.
- PLAN AHEAD: Coordinate with procurement and cleaning services to support sustainable practices.

VÄSTERÅS: Reducing Plastic in Schools

- MAP PLASTIC USE: Identify common plastic items like garbage bags, laminating pouches, and pens.
- **ANALYZE PURCHASES:** Use tools like the Plastic Inventory Tool to track annual plastic use.
- **FOSTER DISCUSSION:** Talk about material use differences between schools to inspire change.
- **SET GOALS AND REVIEW:** Define reduction targets, implement changes, and reassess after a set period.
- **CREATE AN ACTION PLAN:** Develop a local strategy for sustainable plastic use in education.
